- 2. All things in heaven and earth, visible and invisible, were made by Him and for Him.
- 3. He precedes creation and holds all things together.
- 4. He rightly inherits all creation.
- 5. Fullness dwells in Him.
- 6. He will gather everything into Himself.
- 7. He will fill all things.

Implications:

- 1. Everything we know about God must conform to the revelation of Jesus Christ.
 - a. Where scripture is clear there is no option for speculation.
- 2. We can claim no rights, yet have been given tremendous gifts and freedom.
 - a. He has every right to demand, but only loves.
 - b. freedom & responsibility: choice, rewards, consequences (Rev 21:7) 7 "He who overcomes shall <u>inherit all things</u>, and I will be his God and he shall be My son.
- 3. Science reveals Him because it's His design. (Isaac Newton)
 - a. Bible scientifically accurate (Isa 40:22, Job 26:7)
 - b. grand unification theory, Higgs field, force carriers, God particle
 - c. Deism What if God quit paying attention?
- 4. Submit or be subdued. Every knee will bow. (Isa 45:23/Rom 4:11, Phil 2:8-10)
 - a. Psalm 2 describes the worlds response to this truth.
- 5. Completion is found only in Him. (Col 2:9-10)
 - a. You can never be fully you apart from Him.
- 6. There will be only 2 places; in the light or outer darkness. (Mt 8:12, 22:13, 25:30)
- 7. He is an amazing gift!
 - a. Because of the cross, we can enter into Him and receive His fullness now!

(Col 1:15-20) ¹⁵He is the <u>image of the invisible God</u>, the <u>firstborn over all creation</u>. ¹⁶For <u>by Him all things were created</u> that are in heaven and that are on earth, visible and invisible, whether thrones or dominions or principalities or powers. All things were created through Him and for Him. ¹⁷And He is <u>before all things</u>, and <u>in Him all things consist</u>. ¹⁶And He is the head of the body, the church, who is the beginning, the firstborn from the dead, that <u>in all things He may have the preeminence</u>. ¹⁶For it pleased the Father that in Him all the <u>fullness should dwell</u>, ²⁶and by Him to <u>reconcile all things to Himself</u>, by Him, whether things on earth or things in heaven, having made peace through the blood of His cross. (Heb 1:2-3) ²has in these last days spoken to us by His Son, whom He has appointed <u>heir of all things</u>, through whom also <u>He made the worlds</u>; ³who being the brightness of His glory and the <u>express image</u> of His person, and <u>upholding all things</u> by the word of His power, (Ep 1:9-10) ³having made known to us the mystery of His will, according to His good pleasure which He purposed in Himself, ³⁶that in the dispensation of the fullness of the times He might <u>gather together in one all things in Christ</u>, both which are in heaven and which are on earth—in Him.

(Col 2:9-10) For in Him dwells all the fullness of the Godhead bodily; and you are complete in Him, who is the head of all principality and power.

(Ac 17:25, 28) ²⁵"Nor is He worshiped with men's hands, as though He needed anything, since He gives to all life, breath, and all things. ...²⁸"for in Him we live and move and have our being,

(Ep 1:22-23) ²²And He put <u>all things under His feet</u>, and gave Him to be head over all things to the church, ²³which is His body, the <u>fullness of Him who fills all in all</u>.

(Rev 4:11) 11"You are worthy, O Lord, to receive glory and honor and power; for You created all things, and by Your will they exist and were created."

(Ep 4:10) 10 He who descended is also the One who ascended far above all the heavens, that He might fill all things.

(Jn 1:3) 3 All things were made through Him, and without Him nothing was made that was made.

(Ro 11:36) ³⁶For of Him and through Him and to Him are all things, to whom be glory forever. Amen.

(1Co 8:6) ⁶yet for us there is one God, the Father, <u>of whom are all things</u>, and <u>we for Him</u>; and one Lord Jesus Christ, <u>through whom are all things</u>, and <u>through whom we live</u>. (Phl 3:21) ²¹who will transform our lowly body that it may be conformed to His glorious body, according to the working by which He is able even to <u>subdue all things to Himself</u>.
